Moving the old Otsego School to the Firemans Park in Rio



The Firemen determined that they needed a building in the Rio Fireman's Park and In 1961 the first meeting was held by the Rio Firemen to discuss the purchase and move of the old Otsego School. A committee was formed to investigate the school house building and determine if it would be a good purchase. The committee consisted of Carl Beier, Lyle Benzine, Roland Hinzman, Joe Kehoe, and Ole Semonson. On September 14, 1961 a payment of \$100 was made to the Town of Otsego for the buildings. Charlie Leffingwell called the mover to set up a time for moving the school. A decision was made and on April 9, 1962 and Ralph Benzine arranged for them to bring a trailer to move the school to the park and put it in the designated area. I believe they had someone ride on the top of the building with a long pole to lift wires if needed.

Julius Jameson Sr. Worked for the phone company and had to drop phone lines so they could bring the building through to the park.

Over the years the old school house has served the firemen well and continues to be a very useful addition to the Park. Thank you to Brian Johnson for some of the details.
