

Rio Elementary School will be having a Little Viking's Round-up day for all children that are 2 1/2 to 4 years of age. We also encourage children that did not come last year to come this year before they start early learning in the fall. The Little Vikings Round-up day will take place on March 13th, 2026 from 8:30am to 1:30pm where you and your child can come and check out the elementary school and get to know the teachers. The Little Vikings Round-Up day will also include vision, hearing, academic, and speech/language screening via a number of fun activities designed to compare their play, socialization, motor skills, and overall development to levels of other children their age. This is known as the process called Child find. Child Find is a continuous process of public awareness activities, screening and evaluation designed to locate, identify, and refer as early as possible all young children with disabilities and their families who are in need of an Early Intervention Program (Part C) or Early Childhood Special Education (Part B) services of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). Rio School District must locate, identify, and evaluate all resident children with disabilities, including children with disabilities attending private schools, regardless of the severity of their disabilities.
